

GNP Management Plan Help Sheet

Please familiarize yourself with the general information the current Management Plan contains. Some relevant sections are highlighted in yellow for ease of viewing. Noted below are zones where climbing is currently permitted and those where it isn't.

As noted in the current Grampians National Park Management Plan:

Climbing as a recreational activity **is** permitted in the following Management Zones(MZ) and Management Overlays(MO)

Table 3 Page 11 - Summary of Recreation activities

- 1 – Conservation & Recreation Zone (MZ)
- 2 – Conservation Zone (MZ)
- 6 – Remote and Natural Area (MO)

This can be **dependant** though on a number of other factors

- as long as it isn't constrained by any of the overlays
- or by conditions specified elsewhere in the plan – for example negative impacts to cultural or environmental values

Climbing **isn't** permitted in any of the following Management Zones or Overlays

- 5- Reference Area Zones
- 7- Special Protection Area

Zones 3,4,8 are not applicable to rock climbing
